What is Title I?

Saddle Ridge Elementary and Middle School is identified as a Title I School as part of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA). Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support parental involvement. School/Family Involvement Policy and Plan

What is it? This is a plan that describes how Saddle Ridge Elementary and Middle School will provide opportunities to improve parent/family engagement to support student learning. Saddle Ridge Elementary and Middle School will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities, and parents of migratory children. Residential facilities at Saddle Ridge Elementary Middle School attendance area are included in the Family Engagement correspondence and activities.

Where is it available? At the beginning of the year, the plan is sent home with each student attending Saddle Ridge Elementary and Middle School. The plan will be posted on our school website and copies will be available at our Annual Title I Meeting held in September. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center.

2021-2022 District Goals

By May 2020, increase by 9% the number of students performing at or above proficiency in English Language Arts in grade 3-8 as measured by the Georgia Milestones End of Grade Assessment.

2021-2022 School Goals

Increase the Proficient Learner rate in Language Arts for Elementary students in 2018 from 28.9% to 35%.

Increase the Proficient Learner rate in Language Arts for middle school students in 2018 from 43.62% to 49%.
